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Find beauty hiking in Cambria *Open spaces await you on the Central Coast*

CAMBRIA, Calif. (June 1, 2020) — Visitors who love the great outdoors should make sure their next trip includes planning to traverse Cambria's open spaces. With more people looking for activities that can be done safely and socially distant, Cambria has five trails that would be perfect for even the novice hiker. Here are some recommendations for the ideal hiking getaway.

[Fern Canyon Henry Kluck Trail](#) is a trail that leads hikers through the Fern Canyon Preserve. The trail features majestic Monterey pines, oaks, ferns, and a seasonal creek. The trail crosses Fern Drive, and dead-ends in a chaparral near Highway 1. The path is excellent for those who want to experience the open spaces without breaking a sweat.

Visitors who have dreamt of hiking will find that the [Fiscalini Ranch Preserve](#) is a terrific spot to walk. Home to a number of endangered species and species of special concern, the Fiscalini Ranch Preserve offers a beautiful display of nature's diversity with the most dramatic feature being a vast ocean bluff that runs more than a mile along the shoreline of the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary. On this hike, you may be able to capture views of migrating whales, elephant seals, and other ocean mammals. The beaches located along the trails are each unique pieces of art that offer stunning ocean views.

[Lampton Cliffs Park](#), which runs through the Fern Canyon Preserve, features majestic Monterey pines, oaks, ferns, and a seasonal creek. The Lampton Cliffs Park trail, which is just under a mile each way, offers an easy hike for those who are not interested in a long day out but still would like to experience wide-open spaces.

For those who may want a little more time to enjoy the outdoors, there is [Leffingwell Landing Trail](#), a 2-mile hike with stunning views. Just north of Moonstone Beach, this trail offers views of seabirds, occasional sea otters and migrating California Gray Whales sighting during the right season. The trail begins at Shamel. At the marked trail, start heading down to the beach, north across the sandy expanse.

Finally, the [Washburn Campgrounds Trails](#) are for those who are interested in a longer hike. The three-mile trail runs through parts of San Simeon National Park and the Washburn Campground. The Washburn Campground Trails include scenic overlooks, rest-stop benches and interpretive panels with information about the wildlife and the habitat. This trail offers the best that Cambria has to offer with wetlands, pines, and a eucalyptus grove.
